Victor G. "Vic" Anderson, 90, Argyle, died April 3, 2003, at his home, surrounded by his family.

He was born Dec. 13, 1912, in Fayette Township, Lafayette County, the son of Andrew and Clara (Larson) Anderson. On May 17, 1947, Victor was married to Frances J. Spizziri, in Chicago, Ill.
