Adolph Anderson

Adolph Anderson, 78, Darlington, died Sept. 8, 2002, peacefully at his home, surrounded by his family, after a courageous battle with cancer.

He was born Feb. 22, 1924, in rural Argyle, the son of Victor and Minnie (Hovelson) Anderson. Adolph graduated from Darlington High School with the class of 1942. He was united in marriage to Roma Hillary on Aug. 15, 1944, at the Methodist Church in Shullsburg.

Adolph and Roma began farming in 1945 on a farm in Darlington Township. In 1952,

they moved to Wiota where he was active with the youth, working with 4-H, softball games, umpired for girls softball, and served on West Wiota Lutheran Church Council. He played on the home talent league in Darlington and Wiota for thirty plus years, enjoying every moment of it. In 1968, the family moved to Cuba City where they continued farming for the next 18 years. Deciding it was time to retire, they purchased a home in Darlington, moving back to his hometown. He worked as greens-keeper at the Darlington Country Club for the next nine years. Adolph was a charter member of Grace Lutheran Church in Darlington, where he and Roma were janitors for 12 years.
