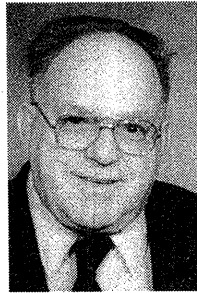


Charles E. Petitgout Jr.
