Marie lived and farmed with her

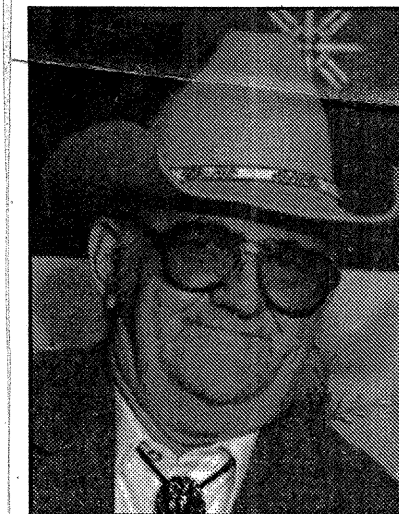
