Frieda L. Kamps

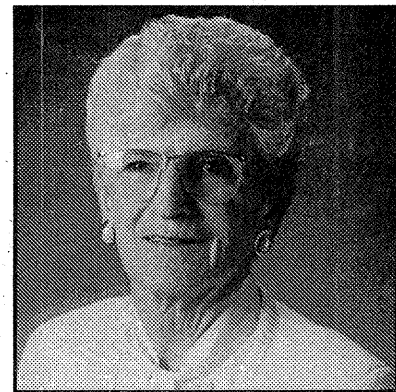
Mrs. Frieda L. Kamps, 92, rural Belmont, died Sunday, Feb. 6, 1994, at her home near Belmont.
