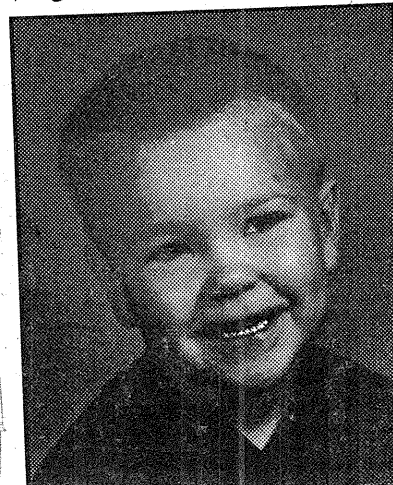
her life. Mr. Welch died Oct. 29, 1986.
