As a Benedictine, Sister Maureen's life work was related to health and religion. She was concerned with rehabilitation - physical, emotional and spiritual. She received degrees in occupational and physical therapy

from St. Catherine's and Northwestern respectively. She received a masters degree in psychiatric O.T. at the University of Nebraska. Completion of master of arts degree in theology and master of divinity at Aquinas Institute further enriched her and led her to clinical pastoral education at Mendota Mental Health Institute in Madison. Since completing her basic and advanced work in CPE in 1980, she had been chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital Medical Center in Madison.

In 1987 the Wisconsin Conference of Churches commended Sister Maureen for her dedicated ministry to members of all faiths and a special concern for parents at the death of a baby. The Wisconsin Chaplaincy Commission awarded her the distinguished service award in 1989. She held memberships in the American Occupational Therapy Association, The National Catholic Chaplain's Association and was a Clinical

Member of the Association for Clinical Pastoral Education.
